The 7 for 17 Awards were awarded at the Global Changemakers Symposium, recognizing young Utahns working to achieve the United Nations 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) while exemplifying Utah Global Diplomacy's core values of respect, social responsibility, and open dialogue.



JAKEY SIOLO SDG #1: No Poverty

Jakey Siolo is a queer Sāmoan, community and political organizer, and community advocate. Currently, Jakey oversees Case Management and advocacy for PIK2AR Pacific Island Knowledge 2 Action Resources, as well as the Senior Engagement and Major Gift Officer at YWCA Utah leading efforts in fundraising and events to support eliminating racism and empowering marginalized communities. Jakey is also the Director of Nuanua Collective, Utah's only organization for LGBTQ+ Native Hawaiian & and Pacific Islanders.

RUBY VEJAR SDG #2: Zero Hunger

Ruby Vejar is a student at Weber State University who uses her spare time to offer free art classes, family photos, music lessons, and scholarships to those in need. She collaborates with the Center for Community Engaged Learning, assisting students dealing with food insecurity and serving as a mentor to support their success. She is a board member of USHEAN, focusing on accessibility and poverty-related issues, and the UServeUtah College Council.

Gabriella Miranda is a Senior at Rowland Hall who works as an educator for Planned Parenthood on their peer-led sex ed council, serves on the American Institute of Research national Youth Engaged 4 Change editorial board and is a member of the United Nations Girl Up Teen Advisory Board. She's served as a part of the Attorney General's Youth Advisory Committee, worked for the Library of Congress, and volunteered with Alliance for a Better Utah, reporting on ongoing gerrymandering legislature in the state.

ANIKA RAO SDG #4: Quality of Education

Anika Rao is a first-year student at The University of Utah studying Political Science and Quantitative Analysis of Markets and Organizations. She has served as the Editor-in-Chief of her high school's newspaper, volunteered with the Salt Lake City Public Library, and mentored for the Salt Lake Peer Court, a restorative alternative to the juvenile justice system. Anika tutors piano students in underserved communities and performs for senior centers with The Mundi Project, a Utah-based music nonprofit.





DANIEL ROMERO-GUERRERO SDG #5: Gender Equality

Daniel Romero-Guerrero is a trans-masculine immigrant from Guadalajara, Jalisco, living in Salt Lake City, studying Gender, Ethnic, & Disability. Daniel is a community health worker with Alliance Community Services, primarily serving the Hispanic and Latine population, sits on the Board of Directors for Utah's LGBTQ+ Chamber of Commerce as the Ambassador Chair, and formerly with Salt Lake County's Mayor's Office of Diversity Inclusion where he led the development, implementation, and evaluation of the Rising Leaders Network.

ELIZA HUNTER SDG #5: Gender Equality

Eliza Hunter fights to combat period poverty in Utah, serving as a Student Ambassador for two years with the Utah Period Project. Working with school administrators and Utah legislators, she promoted HB 162: Period Products in Schools, requiring all public schools in Utah to supply free menstrual products in restrooms, which passed unanimously. She received an honorable mention for her work with the Period Project and currently attends Brigham Young University.





JOSE MANUEL GONZALEZ VERA SDG #10: REDUCED INEQUALITY

Jose Manuel Gonzalez Vera is a doctoral student at Utah State University, working under the mentorship of Dr. Melanie Domenech Rodríguez. His research interests involve improving the psychological well-being of undocumented people. Through his research, Jose Manuel plans to make psychological interventions more accessible to undocumented people. His passion for working with the undocumented community stems from his work with the Latine community, his review of literature on undocumented Latines, and his own experience as an undocumented Mexicano.

Our Sports Diplomacy Symposium had a first-string lineup of speakers, each bringing their unique perspectives and passion for sports diplomacy to the forefront. From the dynamic Abby Cox, Utah's First Lady and force behind the Show Up Initiative, to the indomitable Olympian Catherine Raney Norman, the discussions were as diverse as the sports they represented.

The day started with Dr. Neftalie Williams, San Diego State University and skateboarding diplomat, who demonstrated that action sports like skateboarding are powerful tools for dispelling stereotypes, breaking down barriers, and bridging societal and generational gaps.

The day continued with Adam Miles, the visionary behind Refugee Soccer; Andy Chesnut, General Manager of Warriors Rugby; Danelle Umstead, Paralympian and Sisters in Sports Foundation founder; and duathlon champion Tiffany Schwartz; all speakers illustrating that every sport is a pathway to building bridges and transcending cultural boundaries.

As we gear up for the Salt Lake City Olympics in 2034, these discussions take on added significance. The Sports Diplomacy program served as a rallying point, underlining the potential of sports to create lasting connections and cultural exchanges.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

The International Visitor Leadership Program covers a wide variety of subjects and delegates from all over the world. We were excited to wrap up the year with two incredible women-focused IVLP programs.



Women Entrepreneurs

The International Visitor Leadership Program focused on women entrepreneurs and was a dynamic exploration of entrepreneurship in Utah and the United States. The objectives included examining women-led business efforts and exploring the pivotal role of non-governmental organizations in supporting women-owned businesses. Participants engaged in in-depth discussions on the societal, economic, and political factors influencing private enterprise in the U.S.

The program wasn't just about theory; it delved into practical strategies for job creation and addressed barriers faced by entrepreneurs, especially women and disadvantaged groups. Various business models, from micro-lending to multi-level marketing, were explored, offering a comprehensive view of the entrepreneurial landscape.

Delegates participated in a workshop at The Mill at Salt Lake Community College and a visit to the Salt Lake City Government's Department of Economic Development. It culminated in a program evaluation session and cultural transportation, fostering connections among participants from diverse corners of the globe, including Australia, Cambodia, Japan, Nigeria, and Ukraine.





Women Leaders: Promoting Equality

The International Visitor Leadership Program focused on women's leadership and welcomed delegates from the Near East and North Africa, with a focus on illustrating the rule of law in the U.S. and promoting fair, inclusive, transparent, accessible, and independent judiciaries.

Through various sessions and activities, participants delved into the legal landscape, exploring inspiring female leaders in academia, public service, and the private sector. The agenda included a workshop on the Utah Center for Legal Inclusion, offering insights into leadership skills and mentorship models vital for female lawyers to overcome barriers to professional advancement.

The program facilitated linkages among legal professionals, fostering international cooperation to strengthen women's leadership in and access to justice. A sincere thank you to all who contributed to the success of this enriching exchange.

Dr. Kimberly Madsen, a Graduate Fellowship alumna and Chair of the Board of Directors of Utah Global Diplomacy, not only welcomed the


